4 May 4, 1970 The National Guard opens fire on student protestors at Kent State University, killing four and injuring nine others.

3 August 26-29, 1968 The Democratic Convention was held in Chicago amid violent anti-war demonstrations.

1 August 11, 1965 The Watts Riots begin, lasting six days and killing thirty-four people.

2 April 4, 1968, Dr. Martin Luther King was murdered, setting off riots in over one hundred cities.
